FEAST OF ST CATHERINE OF SIENA: Celebrated on April 29. One of our Parish Primary schools is named after St Catherine who was the youngest of 25 children born of a wealthy Italian family in c1347. From a young age she devoted her life to prayer and is credited with composing over 400 letters, her Dialogue, which is her definitive work, and her prayers. Pope Paul VI declared her a doctor of the Church, along with Teresa of Avila. St Catherine was an important defender of the papacy. She is a patron saint of Europe and Italy and the patron saint of journalists, media and nursing.

Her most famous quote is: "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire."

REFLECTION – Lisa-Marie Calderone-Stewart

The vine is the lifeline for the branches. If branches are cut off from the vine, they die. Jesus is our lifeline and he often works through the people in our life.

Who do you know that acts as an emotional lifeline for you? Who gives you life and support and strength?

The Scriptures tell us that those who live in Jesus do good work and bear much fruit—apart from Jesus, we cannot do anything worth doing. Do you know people who clearly live in Jesus and are doing good work? What are they like? How do you know they are living in Jesus? What good work do they do? How can you be more like them? Jesus says that if his words are living within us, whatever we ask for in prayer shall be granted. What does it mean

to have Jesus' words living within us? If his words are truly living within us, then what would our prayer be like?

O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

FIRST READING: Acts 9: 26-31

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus. The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

GOSPEL: John 15: 1-8
